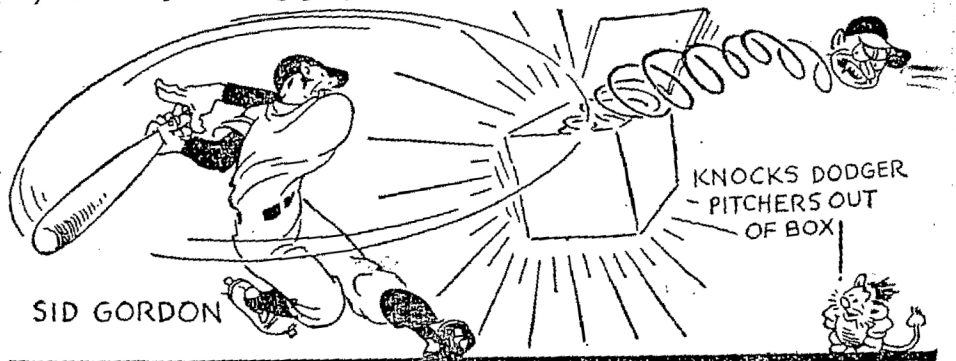


Now let's look at Sid's record against the Dodgers.

Had Impressive Record With Giants

In the past five seasons he has hit more home runs at Ebbets Field (22) than any visiting player. Kiner is second with 18. In 1952 he hit



four home runs against Preacher Roe. He has hit eight against the Preacher since he became a Dodger in 1948.

1951

April 24—Hit three-run homer in eighth to beat Dodgers.

July 3—Hit bases-filled single in ninth to defeat Dodgers.

These two victories was the difference at the end of the season. The Giants and Dodgers finished even.

1952

May 30—Hit two homers for three runs, but Dodgers won, 5-4.

Sept. 4—Singled home the winning run in 11th as Braves scored their first 1952 victory over the Dodgers.
